Pathways to a creative future

Lighthouse Academy is the new flagship programme for creative engagement at Lighthouse. It aims to reach young people and artists to offer training and development opportunities in the Arts.

It will act as a safe space for artists and young people to explore creative ideas and develop artistic networks. It aims to be a beacon for artistic progression and development not just in the South-West but nationally.

It includes Sanctuary, our artist development programme focused on championing exceptional artists, supporting work in development and nurturing the next generation of creatives in Dorset, to produce and deliver extraordinary creative experiences to our audiences.

Artists are facing challenges in these uncertain times. We've supported 40 artists already with Sanctuary and you can help us to provide more with free space, to think, dream, play, try, fail, succeed, finesse, and create new shows or ideas, and to fund technical support, travel and accommodation.

With your help we can expand opportunities for artists in our spaces, to help them keep working, creating new work, adding to Dorset's reputation as a creative hot spot and Lighthouse as a venue to see cutting edge work.



Support Arts education

PARTNER SCHOOLS

This scheme has supported 21 schools, providing opportunities for young people, their teachers and their parents to engage with the wide-range of Arts opportunities offered at Lighthouse, with backstage tours, workshops, residencies, work experience and internships.

People like you have helped children from all backgrounds achieve their Arts Awards, enhanced creative education and access to arts and theatre experiences.

YOUNG PEOPLE

Lighthouse works outside of formal education with young people to support and enable their first encounters with the Arts and creative industries.

YOUNG WRITERS

Young Writers gives 38 young people the chance to attend workshops led by professional writers, to attend Lighthouse performances, to see their work published online, in print, and performed on a stage before a live audience.

YOUNG TECHNICIANS

Young Technicians gives young people (16-19) who are interested in getting to grips with lighting, sound and stage management the opportunity to develop skills and experience on a 12-week course run by professional technicians. Your support helps us provide more structured programmes to develop the skills of young people keen for a career in theatre.



Maintain a world-class venue

The overwhelming challenge going forward into 2023 will be to make the most of the support we have received to survive during the period of the pandemic, to retain staff, maintain delivery, rebuild demand and capacity and to begin, once again, building on our overall business plan objectives in the new environment. The cultural and hospitality sector have been severely wounded first by Covid and now by the impact of world events.

We are particularly concerned about inflation and huge hikes in energy costs as well as a pressure on funders and the overall impact on demand as audiences feel the costof-living increases.

Despite the uncertainty and challenging year ahead, what we know is that our community wants and needs culture – whatever the external pressures – and Lighthouse will continue to provide it with your support.
